Charlotte Harden leaves her height to Garry Oliver and her weird ways to Doris Cassell.


Martha Cassell wills her ability to sing to Larry Cox and her ability to get along with teachers to Charles Neel and Larry Hanshew.

Donna Houck is married to an accountant, has two sets of twins, and now resides in Washington, D.C.


Joan Umbarger is very happily married and lives in Kentucky. Besides watching the household budget, she watches two mischievous kids.
