Message from the President

On August 3rd, 2024, the Sluss Family organized a family gathering to commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the Sluss Family Massacre. This reunion was a somber yet poignant gathering, as descendants from far and wide came together to honor the memory of their ancestors. The reunion was held at the Gym in Ceres (Bland County, Virginia), about a mile from Sharon Church where a Memorial Marker stands as a silent witness to the passage of time and the resilience of the family.

Despite the tragic history, the atmosphere was one of unity and remembrance. Stories of bravery, survival, and the strength of the Sluss lineage were shared, bringing tears to many eyes and a sense of pride to every heart. The younger generation listened intently, learning about the past that shaped their present. The day was filled with activities designed to celebrate both the lives lost and the enduring spirit of the Sluss family. A communal meal brought everyone together, reinforcing the bonds of kinship.

After the meal, and much needed time together, many of the family traveled to Sharon Church and Cemetery, the supposed location of the Sluss family burial. The family then traveled to the massacre site, many of which had never set foot on the soil where their ancestors were slain. The somber moment was brightened as a beautiful rainbow positioned itself just above the location where their ancestors' home once stood. It was almost as if the slain Sluss family members placed the rainbow to welcome these descendants home. With eyes full of tears and hearts overflowing with love, everyone was rooted directly to this spot, together, where their family members drew their last breath some



REMEMBERING OUR FRIEND: BARBARA LABAN



BARBARA SUE LABAN, 81, of Bastian, VA, passed away peacefully on Sunday, May 5, 2024, at Bland County Nursing & Rehab. She was born June 3, 1942, in Columbus, OH, the daughter of the late Edward & Esther Hall.

Barbara attended Bastian Union Church and Bastian Church of God. Her personal walk with the Lord taught her to fear not and be not dismayed because she knew the Lord was with her always. She enjoyed cross stitch and needlepoint, was a Master Gardener (2003) and loved cats.

Barbara achieved a Bachelor of Science degree and Master's of Science degree (1966) from University of Oregon. She went on to be a high school educator for many years. She taught at St. Joseph Catholic School ('72-'74), Bollingbrook Private School ('75-'83) and at Prince George County High School ('83-'96), all which were located in the Petersburg, VA area. She was a past president in the Petersburg, VA, local Learning Disabilities Chapter.

She completed the full process (2003) to become a Black's Fort Chapter member of the Virginia Daughters of the American Revolution in Abingdon, VA.

She and her beloved husband enjoyed many activities together but were especially proud of their participation in the Triangle Search and Rescue, Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Emergency Management Search and Rescue member (2003), the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary – Charleston, WV region in which she held many titles for 10 years and the National Cave Rescue (1994). Once they relocated to Bastian, VA, Barbara enjoyed volunteer work. She was a volunteer for the Bland Historical Society, the Wolf Creek Indian Village, in Hospice for over 10 years and enjoyed working in many capacities during Bastian Union Church activities.

Barbara was preceded in death by her parents, Edward Sterling & Esther Barbara Shircliffe Hall, her husband of 51 years, Dr. Cornelis Laban and her brother, Robert Sterling Hall.

Left to cherish her memory are her two sons & daughter-in-law, Chris & Jessica Laban and Doug Laban; her daughter & son-in-law, Petra Laban & Robert Seubert; her beloved grandchildren, Robbie and Katarina; her siblings, Steven, Gary, Michael, Pamela, Deborah, Cynthia, Russell and Patricia; a special friend and caregiver, Angie Hodge; and her special cat companions, "Mittens" and "Midnight." 
