



# Looking at the '89-90 school year







The evening was topped off with a victory over Galax.









and Christmas candy.




# Where do we go from here?





# One last look at freedom






# One last look as the 80s end






Band students are looking forward to the proposed new construction. Then they will have their own classroom instead of having to meet in the lunchroom (the cooks can then remove the ear pluqs).






#### Profuse workers



T wo armed opponents took their places on opposite sides of the net, sizing up each other. For girl's tennis team, '89 was a successful season.


Under the coaching of Mr. Robin Thacker and the work of talented players they made

self-confidence to each player, whether batting or fielding.









TOP: Randy Townley steps to the plate, eyes a good ball, and strikes wood to cloth, only to create a foul ball.

Many of the team will move upward to varsity status and new members will have to fill their places for a new season, but members and coach feel challenged and ready.





#### First game victory carried to tournaments










#### Auditions were part of a cheerleaders life








fans from the school and community, gave Rocket basketball a season to remember.

The Mountain Empire District MVP honor went to senior Chad Thompson. Patrick Smith was named to the All-District Team and David King received an honorable mention.














# Enthusiasm dampened



#### That one last look


